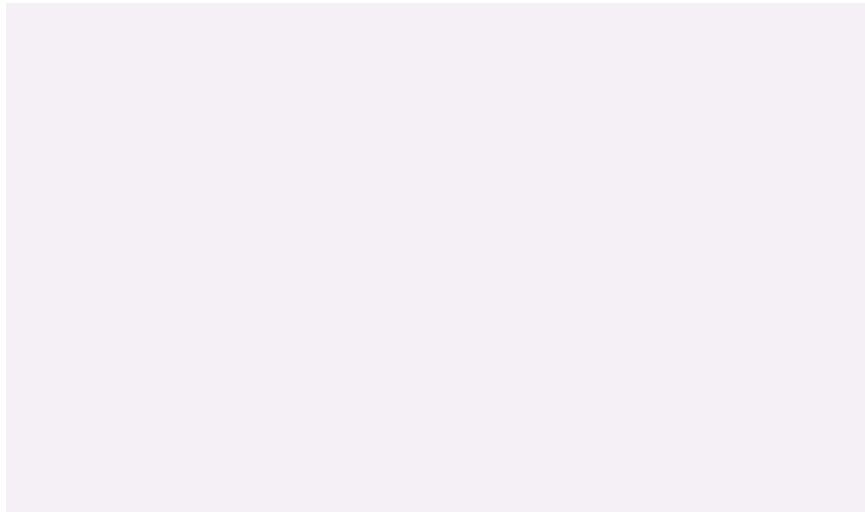

1st Sunday of Advent | Luke 1:1-23 | Zechariah & Gabriel

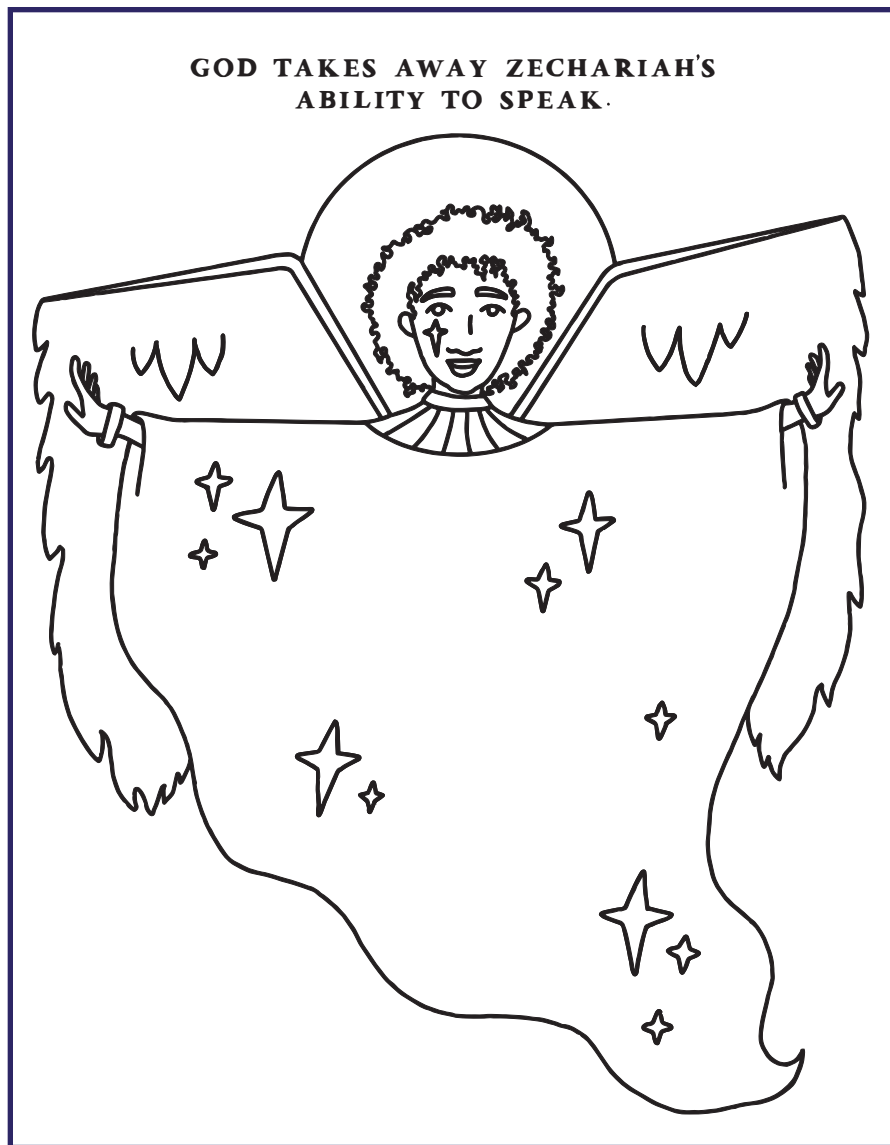
THE ANGEL GABRIEL TELLS ZECHARIAH
