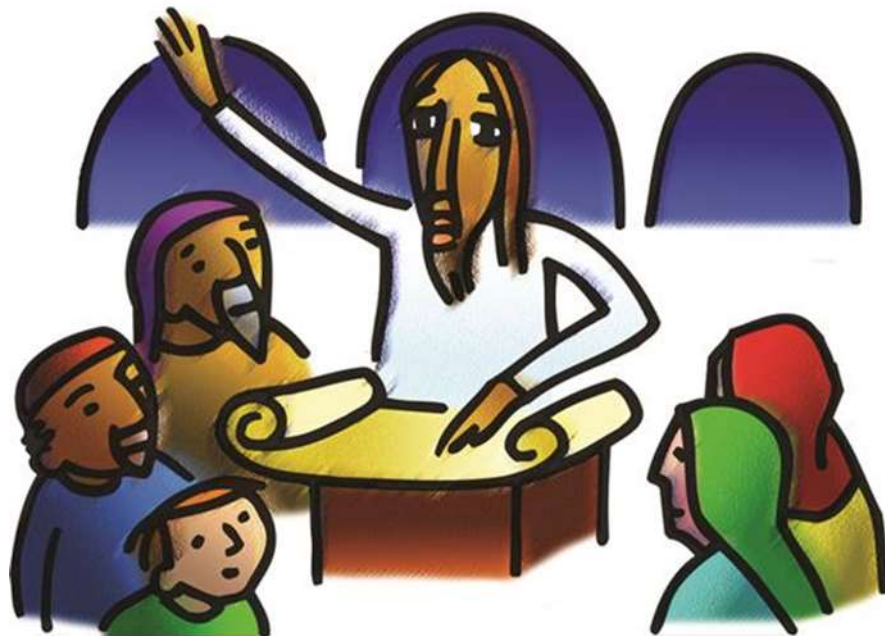

For the past five weeks, our gospel readings have been from the 6th chapter of John....all the readings having something to do with "bread." Bread, in all of its many forms, has been part of human existence since at least 30,000 years ago.

During these weeks in worship, we have focused on the importance of "bread" in our spiritual and physical lives. And, we have "experienced" different breads during Holy Communion, from different cultures and countries (the gluten free wafers are always available).

Hawaiian sweet bread, is originally from Portugal that came to Hawaii from the Azores. It was known as "stone bread" because it would harden very quickly, until a baker from HI tweaked the recipe into what we now have as King's Hawaiian Bread.
