

From Pastor Karla

Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Wow! How did we get here already? To December? I am always a bit conflicted at this time of year....I love the church season of Advent, but do not enjoy the short (often grey sky) days of this time of year. So, when I saw

the topic, "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?" from "A Sanctified Art" ("a ministry to support worshiping communities in integrating art and creativity into their spiritual practices" www.asanctifiedart.org) for Advent....it summed up my conflict = I can feel weary (grey) and rejoice (Advent!) at the same time.

The theme comes from a line from the hymn "O Holy Night" – "a thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices". With each week (1st Sunday of Advent through Baptism of the Lord Sunday), we will have a sub-theme:

- "We acknowledge our weariness"
- "We find joy in connection"
- "We allow ourselves to be amazed"
- "We sing stories of hope"
- "We make room"
- "We root ourselves in ritual"
- "We trust our belovedness"

We will explore all of this **together**, **as a community**. As they describe this Advent: "We will hold space for our weariness and our joy. We will seek a 'thrill of hope' in our hurting world. We will welcome joy – even and especially if, like the prophet Isaiah, we cry out for comfort (Is. 40:1 – "Comfort, o comfort my people, says your God."). In this weary world, may we find many ways to rejoice."

Keep reading and you will see all the many ways that we can **come together**, **as a community...as the Body of Christ**, to worship...to share our sorrows and our joys. Our Sunday worship services will be a bit more meditative; the mid-week services will be earlier in the evening, 6:00pm with the beautiful service of "Holden Evening Prayer"; we will gather in a barn to sing our praises; we will come together the MORNING of Christmas Eve (4th Sunday of Advent) for a completely different and fun "brown bag pageant" and return that evening for Holy Communion and Candle Lighting to welcome the Christ Child.

When we are weary, we can endure it much more easily when we are surrounded by our community. When we are joyful, we want to celebrate with our community. My prayer for the upcoming seasons of Advent and Christmas, is that WE, as the Lord of Life community, do come together!!!! I invite you to ALL of the services...maybe try the mid-week service if you have never attended one before.

Let us, together, acknowledge our weariness and find joy in connecting with our community.
