## From Pastor Karla



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

The days are slowly getting "longer," with a bit more daylight, every day, as we journey through winter. We will soon begin our journey through Lent. Our theme for Lent this year is "Created for Community." This series comes from our own ELCA resource, "Sundays and Seasons". This is the description:

The invitation to Lent spoken on Ash Wednesday reminds us that we enter this season together 'with the whole church'. It goes on to state that 'we are created for communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation.' Though many common Lenten practices rightly invite us to individual acts of 'repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love,' Lent is also a time for deepening of community.

In the early church, the weeks before Easter were a time in which the whole community took responsibility for the training of catechumens. Not only were the catechumens enriched by this formation, but those already within the community were strengthened in their faith along with them. Using readings from Mark's gospel, this series invites the assembly to reflect on what it means to be in community with one another, with the world, with creation, and with God."

So, yes, we will each have our individual journey through Lent, but ultimately the journey through Lent is with our community, the Lord of Life community. As Jesus journeyed to the Cross, His disciples were with him…even if they fell asleep on him. Let us journey, as a community, through Lent.

On January 11, John Deere Foundation and River Bend Food Bank jointly hosted a celebration at The John Deere Pavilion to celebrate the conclusion of the Plowing a New Path to End Hunger match campaign.

The campaign began in August 2023 with a pledge from The John Deere Foundation to match community donations raised by River Bend Food Bank up to \$650,000. This investment, combined with matching community donations, will allow River Bend to purchase an additional 6.5 million meals, closing the meal gap in Scott, Rock Island, and Dubuque Counties.

We are excited to report that a total of \$1,611,200 was raised through this campaign! Our community once again stepped up to the challenge! This investment, combined with matching community donations, will allow River Bend to purchase an additional 8 million meals, closing the meal gap for one whole year in Scott, Rock Island, and Dubuque Counties.

As we celebrate this accomplishment together, we can take pride in knowing that we live in a community that truly cares about every one of our neighbors. In that spirit, you can rest assured that River Bend Food Bank will continue its commitment to ending hunger, and our partnerships are stronger than ever!
