

From Pastor Karla

Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What a time it is to be a part of the community of Lord of Life Lutheran Church!!! I am continually blessed by all that is happening inside our walls and outside of the building. The Holy Spirit is moving, I have no doubt!!!

The photo on the cover of this newsletter was painted for me by Sally Sena in 2002. You can see Sally with the painting on this page. When my hubby and I got to live in Alice Springs, Australia,



I was blessed to be able to work at Yirara College (a boarding school for Australian Aboriginal students). Sally was one of the many students that taught me so much while I was there. This is a "dot painting" which is one of the many beautiful ways Aboriginal art is expressed. These are Sally's words to describe her painting:

"It is Jesus and the 12 Disciples. The smaller "u" shapes represent the disciples and the larger "u" shape is Jesus. They are sitting around the cross which reminds me of Jesus' holiness and how He died for the forgiveness of our sins."

This painting hangs in my office. It is a continual reminder for me that Jesus was not alone in his ministry ... which reminds me that WE are not alone in the continuation of Jesus' ministry ... all the ministry that takes place at LOL and in the community.

And we are able to do ALL of this ... first, of course, because the Holy Spirit is moving, and second, people are living out their baptismal callings, as individuals and in and for the community of Lord of Life Lutheran Church.

As I said in a recent sermon: "I said this as the 'Invitation to Lent': 'Friends in Christ, today with the whole church...' I remind us all that what began for us, individually....our baptism...brings us together as a community for the sake of the whole world...so, with the whole church we journey together in Lent." Faith Forward: families passing faith on

Pastor Karla applied for Lord of Life Lutheran Church to be part of the 2023-2024 Faith Forward cohort.....and we were accepted! This is going to be an exciting program to be part of...it will be added training to what we already do with our Intergenerational Faith Formation. Pastor Karla will go to Grandview University in Des Moines, at the end of April for initial training.

Read more about it:

"Faith Forward will teach congregations, parents, and grandparents to tell the Biblical and family stories of God's mercy, grace, love, boundaries, protection, promises, and faithfulness. As parenting trends and church attendance change in a post-pandemic world, this program has been designed to help pastors, parents, and grandparents pass on their Christian faith to the next generation. A paradigm shift to a home-centered faith formation requires trusted partners, a strong foundation of relationships and accountability, and an openness to God's Spirit as it moves in new directions. Faith Forward wants to see parents and grandparents share the faith and values with the church's treasure and future, our children and youth.

Faith Forward has a three-fold aim:

- 1. EMPOWER rural and small congregations to more effectively work with parents, grandparents, and faith mentors through the normal routines of congregational life to help them hand down their Christian faith and values to the next generation.
- 2. EQUIP parents and grandparents with doable, repeatable, livable faith practices.
- 3. ENCOURAGE parents and grandparents in creating homegrown faith through easy-to-use activities and resources which weave faith formation into the normal routines of family life.

Faith Forward is funded by the Christian Parenting and Caregiving Initiative of the Lilly Endowment Inc. housed at Grand View University, and works in collaboration with Peer Ministry." (https://www.grandview.edu/faith-forward)

"Share Our Abundance" Capital Campaign

In 2021, this capital campaign was started and it was planned to be a 3-year campaign. Our pledges for this campaign were an addition to our "general fund" pledges that we do in November of every year.

The "general fund" supports the day-to-day life of the church, salaries, monthly bills, etc. One of the goals of "Share Our Abundance" was to provide for our mortgage payments. We keep SOA funds separate to assure that SOA pledges go directly to the goals of the capital campaign.

Currently, our general fund is looking strong ... because of your generous giving and not paying a full-time pastor. Our SOA pledges will end in April. Without continued support after April, SOA funds will not be sufficient to cover our mortgage.

2024 is an exciting time for Lord of Life! But it also means some decisions are on hold. The church council feels it's best to delay the next capital campaign until a full-time pastor is called. This will give the Church time to call our new pastor and to allow them time to work with the Church Council to develop the next capital campaign. We are asking all who pledged in 2021 to extend their pledge through April, 2025.

In April, you will receive a separate letter explaining options in more detail. In the meantime, thank you, thank you, thank you for ALL of your support for the daily ministries of Lord of Life and for your generosity!!!


Jennifer acquired a reputation for braiding hair. She did many. Jennifer and Kay were on a medical team.
