Call Process

In May, your church council met with Assistant to the Bishop Steve Brackett to discuss the call process. The Synod staff will assist us as we move through this transition. The steps we will follow are outlined below.

- **1.** Assigning an interim pastor. Rev. Karla Wildberger has agreed to serve as our part-time interim. She will once again walk with us as we move through the process. Thank you, Pastor Karla!
- **2.** The church council will form a call committee. Our desire is to have a balanced committee of 5-7 people who represent a cross section of the congregation. If asked, we hope you will respond Yes! to serve on this important element of the call process. Assistant to the Bishop Steve Brackett will meet with the call committee.
- **3.** The call committee will complete a Ministry Site Profile. The purpose of the profile is to provide the Synod and pastors seeking calls with a picture of our congregation. The profile includes information about what the congregation collectively seeks in our next pastor. The congregation will have an opportunity to contribute to this process. The council will present a summary Profile to the congregation for its endorsement.
- **4.** Once the Ministry Site Profile is submitted to the Synod, the Synod will provide names to the call committee of interested pastors who match the needs of our congregation.

- **5.** The call committee determines potential candidates for call and arranges interviews. Once interviews are completed, the committee will vote to recommend a candidate to the council. After discussion, the council will vote to recommend the candidate and compensation package to the congregation.
- 6. The congregation will have an opportunity to meet the candidate.
- **7.** At a congregational meeting, two votes will be taken. The first vote is whether to extend the call, and the second vote is to establish the compensation package. The candidate will be notified about the result of the vote.
- **8.** Once a vote to extend the call is made, a Letter of Call is issued. The pastor has 30 days to consider the call.
- 9. Upon acceptance of the call, an installation date is determined.

I will keep the congregation updated on progress as we move through this process. Please feel free to contact me if you have questions.
