From Pastor Paul

What do you think of when you read the word, "fellowship?" I want to think about fellowship in a couple of ways in this article. The first, God as the model of perfect fellowship, can seem hard to grasp. God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, are in eternal relationship and acts of self-giving love. As Cheree Hayes writes, "This fellowship is the essence of Heaven—full of joy, generosity, and peace."

Fellowship is modeled for us and it is what God desires for us. In its purest form for the church, it is about the sharing of resources for the betterment of our community. I think that fellowship is also how we share ourselves with each other in friendship and in caring for each other. Fellowship, in this latter sense, is something that we will need to work hard to recover as a congregation.


