

Greetings Sisters and brothers in Christ,

I'm back!!! I had a fabulous trip to Eastern France and Siciliy...so many stories and photos to share. I saw and experienced so many



In last month's newsletter, I talked about what it means to be a disciple and I asked you to think and pray about how each of us live, hear, share, proclaim, serve and strive as we live out our baptisms and my hope ... and prayer ... is that you have been thinking about this. Last month, I also shared with you a few Dietrich Bonhoeffer quotes ..."the call to follow at once produces a new situation".....

As I write this article and ponder that quote, I think of our guide we had in Sicily....when it was time to "go" (get off the bus, start walking, etc.), she would say, "Amuninni (aa-moo-nin-nee)!!!" And then we would all reply, "Amuninni!" Amuninni is the Sicilian way of saying, "let's go!" (the rest of Italy says, "Andiamo"). Our guide, Virginia, would say this as a way to tell us it was time to go, but mostly, she said this as a way to get us excited!!!

Amuninni!!! This is what I say to all of you – we have been called as God's disciples ... God's hands here on earth and there are things to do and people to see and God's love and grace to share. Time to Clean the Closet

With our cooler temperatures, you may find yourself cleaning closets or going through your drawers. Perhaps you will discover that you are tired of an old sweater or that the outfit that you purchased last fall just isn't as appealing as it was a year ago. Other items that are always helpful include bedding, blankets, and towels/hand towels/washcloths. Your donations may be placed in the plastic containers near the mailboxes at church. Hiway Cleanup Time!!

Lord of Life volunteers will again do a litter cleanup along the Northwest Arterial this fall. In 2002, we "adopted" a one-mile-long stretch along the last northbound stretch of road, on both sides of the bike/pedestrian trail. We do this twice yearly, in the spring and the fall. Volunteers will gather at 9:00 AM on Saturday, October 14 at the lower level of the church, be issued safety vests, trash bags and "grabber" tools, and carpool to the Arterial.
