From Pastor Karla

As Jesus was walking along, he saw Levi son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and Jesus said to him, 'follow me.'

And Levi got up and followed Jesus." - Mark 2:14

Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This is the verse which begins Dietrich Bonhoeffer's chapter 2, "The Call to Discipleship", in his book, The Cost of Discipleship. I have been thinking about "discipleship" quite a bit lately and I usually end up with this book in my hand. (If you have this book, pick it up again and take another read, you will always find something new!) Here are a few lines from this chapter:

"It is Jesus who calls...When we are called to follow Christ, we are summoned to an exclusive attachment to his person. The grace of his call bursts all the bonds of legalism. It is a gracious call, a gracious commandment...Christ calls, the disciple follows: that is grace and commandment in one...Discipleship means adherence to Christ, and, because Christ is the object of that adherence, it must take the form of discipleship...The call to follow at once produces a new situation. To stay in the old situation makes discipleship impossible." (pp. 61, 63, 67)

When we were baptized, we immediately became a disciple. Promises were made on our behalf and then those promises were affirmed at the time of our confirmation:

"You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the Covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

To **live** among God's faithful people,

To **hear** the word of God and **share** in the Lord's supper,

To **proclaim** the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

To **serve** all people, following the examples of Jesus,

And to **strive** for justice and peace in all the earth?

The response: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me." (ELW p. 236)

Being a disciple... this is what I challenge us all to think about...pray about...how do each of us live, hear, share, proclaim, serve and strive? This will be our focus in confirmation class, and I would like it to be our focus, as a community, a congregation. How do we live out our faith: At church? At home? At school? At work?

As Bonhoeffer wrote, "the call to follow at once produces a new situation". We have been called to follow. What new situation might be produced for you? Think about it. Pray about it.

Dear Members and Friends of Lord of Life:

"Our greatest responsibility is to be good ancestors." Jonas Salk



As I write this I have just returned from a trip through England and Scotland. I learned a great deal about the history of these countries, which dates back thousands of years. One of our stops was Stonehenge. This place has been occupied by people as far back as 3000 BC! The stones were brought up the hill and placed so that major seasonal events could be measured. By aligning the "heel stone" (a stone placed outside the circle of stones) with a stone placed in the center of the circle, ancient peoples could determine the longest and shortest days of the year. The change of seasons was important to decisions about planning, herding, and gathering in preparation for winter. They likely had no idea about the impact their daily lives might have on future generations.

Throughout history, people have taken great care to lay a good foundation for the future. All we can see is the end product of Stonehenge, but it was probably built over several years and with much discussion and experimentation. Small decisions added up to the final product that we appreciate 5000 years later.

As I viewed Stonehenge (and for that matter many other historical sites representing centuries of events) it gave me a sense of the small piece of history each of us holds. For us today, it's hard to imagine how the collective work we do now may impact future generations.

One small slice of our congregation's history is being undertaken by the work of the call committee. The committee's work is important and will take time. In August, the committee met several times. They continue working on the Ministry Site Profile, and this is where you can help.

The call committee is preparing to distribute a congregational survey. Details as to distribution of the survey are being finalized, but at the September 17th worship services we will begin the process with a blessing and prayer. Over the course of several weeks and through your participation in the survey, you will have the opportunity to provide your perspective on our next steps as a congregation. Surveys will be collected and collated to help build a picture of Lord of Life. This information will be included in the Ministry Site Profile submitted to the Synod.

As we all create our daily pieces of history, whether that be in our work as a church, in our professions, in our schools, or in our community, I ask that you continue to pray for our call

committee and council members.
